New facility scheduled to open in 2012

In a few short months, Clark Regional will open a brand new facility to replace CRMC's current facility. The 131,000 square-foot, \$60 million, 79-bed facility, will feature state-of-the-art technology, electronic medical records and will be geared more toward outpatient services to better meet the needs of residents of the communities we serve.

Contributing to our local tax base

Last year, Clark Regional Medical Center paid more than \$1.9 million in property and sales taxes which helped support our city, county and state. These dollars help support local schools, develop roads, recruit business and industry, and provide other vital community services.

Helping those in need

Clark Regional Medical Center provided nearly \$40.2 million in uncompensated care last year, which included the charges not covered by Medicare and Medicaid. The amount includes \$6.2 million for charity care and bad debt, incurred as we served many people without the financial resources to pay for basic health services.

Adding new physicians

During the past year, Clark Regional Medical Center has added two new physicians to our highly respected medical staff, including specialists in cardiology /internal medicine and pediatrics.

One of our community's major employers

With an annual payroll of \$18.1 million and more than 430 employees, Clark Regional Medical Center is one of the largest employers in Clark County. This means that our staff and their families attend many of the same schools, shop at the same grocery stores, and volunteer their time and resources for the same organizations as you do.
